



An important message for all Participants

STAY SAFE

Before...

- **Visit your site**, assess it for possible hazards. Youth are not encouraged to clean along roadsides or highways or around parked cars. For shoreline cleanups, schedule your clean-up when the water will be at a safe level
- **What equipment do you need?** Safety vests? Gloves? Rakes, shovels?
- (Remember to arrange to collect your free garbage pitch-in bags and gloves from Utilities and Environmental Services)
- **How many supervisors will you need**, if working with a youth group or young children?
- **What will you do with the garbage you collect?** What can you recycle?

During...

- Closely supervise the project and the participants. Do not allow youth to go near or in bush or wilderness areas alone!
- Do not allow participants to pick up any dangerous items, including broken glass, discarded needles, etc. Telephone the Utilities and Environmental Services department and let them know where these items are and they will be picked up safely. **604 894-6371**
- **NEVER** attempt to clean up the remnants of a squatters camp – call Utilities and Environmental Services to assist.
- Remind all participants to be very careful around parked cars, driveways and along roads and shorelines.
- Do not allow participants to carry heavy or bulky items.
- Arrange to properly dispose of all non-recyclable litter – one landfill waiver will be given to each registered group to attend the landfill with this litter.
- Wash hands thoroughly at the conclusion of the project.
