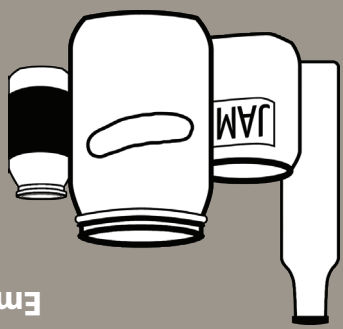

- Plastic trays & clamshells
- Plastic jars & lids
- Plastic trays & tops
- Cartons & cups
- Plastic bottles, caps & pumps
- Spiral wound paper cans
- Steel and aluminum cans, trays, foil & lids
- Non-durable plastic food containers
- Spray bottles

Wildlife

Access to waste (garbage, recycling and organics) is a leading cause of wildlife conflicts. Keep wildlife wild and your community safe:

- ✓ Store waste indoors or in bear-resistant containers. Truck canopies are not bear-resistant.
- ✓ Ensure recyclables are clean & stored indoors.
- ✓ Freeze smelly items in newspaper & rinse organic collection bins.

Leaving attractants accessible to wildlife is against SLRD bylaws & the BC Wildlife Act.

INVASIVE SPECIES

Help to reduce their impacts and make a difference to support healthier communities by:

- ✓ **Choosing non invasive plants.**
Explore beplantwise.ca for ideas.
- ✓ **When cleaning your yard:**
 1. Separate invasives from other yard waste for safe disposal.
 2. Place them on a tarp/ bag & seal it.
 3. Dispose of invasive plants in your garbage (landfill waste).
 4. **Do not compost!**

Garbage to Landfill



Reduce costs by reducing waste.

Commercial loads or loads greater than a pickup truck: Take to the Whistler Waste Transfer Station.

Not accepted in garbage:

- Hazardous waste
- Animal carcasses
- Recyclables; sort accordingly
- Drywall*

* Accepted at the Whistler Waste Transfer Station and on rotation at the Pemberton Transfer Station

TIPPING FEES

Waste management fees are collected by taxes & tipping fees. Tipping fees ensure that those who generate the waste help to cover the disposal cost.

Effective January 1, 2023

Good news! More items are now accepted for recycling.

Your single-use and packaging-like products can now be recycled from home and the depot through Recycle BC's updated program.

- ✓ **Paper**
 - Paper party decorations
 - Paper gift bags
 - Paper lunch bags
 - Moving and storage boxes
 - Paper gift boxes
- ✓ **Flexible Plastics (Depot only)**
 - Sandwich and freezer bags
 - Plastic reusable shopping bags
 - Squishy cushion packaging
 - Plastic wrap
 - Plastic drop sheets or covering
 - Plastic recycling bags
- ✓ **Containers**
 - Aluminum foil trays and pie plates
 - Plastic food storage containers
 - Plastic and paper cups, plates, and bowls
 - Disposable hangers
 - Plastic plant pots
 - Metal storage containers (e.g. for candy, etc.)
 - Plastic utensils and straws



Reuse what you can. Recycle what you can't.



Flexible Plastics

Accepted: Empty & Rinsed



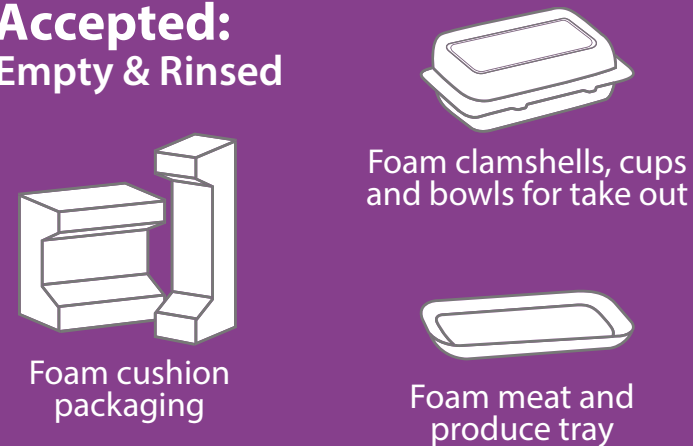
Not accepted:

- Plastic-lined paper or paper-lined plastic ●
- Biodegradable or compostable plastic ●
- Plastic squeeze tubes (e.g. tooth paste) ●
- Plastic strapping ●
- PVC or Vinyl ●



Foam Packaging White & Coloured

Accepted: Empty & Rinsed



Not accepted:

- Foam packing chips, peanuts or noodles ●
- Liquid absorbing pads or stretch wrap ●
- Blue or pink foam board insulation ●



Batteries in the wrong place cause fires

- Household batteries
