

### Emergency Services and Public Safety

- Emergency vehicles will have access to all roadways and given priority access, with roads supervised by a professional traffic management team and the RCMP.
- Pemberton Music Festival will provide on-site medical and emergency response teams to minimize impacts on Pemberton's community urgent care services.

### Mountain Bike Trail Access

- All area mountain bike trails will remain open but expect congestion and please use caution around the festival site.
- Biking to the festival? Cyclists are asked to use primarily off Hwy99 routes: Urdal to Fraser Connector to Fekker Trail to Lillooet Bridge to Pemberton Farm Road East to Friendship Trail to festival; or
- Pemberton Creek dyke trail to Airport Road to Lillooet River Bridge to Pemberton Farm Road East to Friendship Trail to festival (see routing map inside)

# Getting Around on Festival Weekend

Public safety and keeping traffic flowing are our top priorities. The festival requires no road closures, but traffic will be slowed along Hwy99 by the festival area for everyone's safety.

## Non-Local Traffic

- The festival traffic plan works to minimize individual vehicle traffic. Non-local ticket buyers must purchase weekend camping or a Whistler shuttle pass.
- Primary camper parking is on the south side of Hwy99, east of the festival site. Camper vehicles will be marshaled off the highway onto a temporary road leading to primary camper parking on IR2, minimizing traffic congestion.
- A temporary pedestrian bridge will be erected over Hwy99, allowing festivalgoers to cross the highway safely without disrupting traffic.

## Local Traffic

- Local residents are encouraged to leave vehicles at home. Plan ahead to stock up on food and beverage items or get errands done in advance of the festival (garbage drop-off, mail pick-up, etc.).

## Local Transport to the Festival

- There is no general day parking at the festival site.
- The easiest way to access the festival is by bicycle or walking. There will be ample bike parking at the festival.
- If you live farther away, take the locals-only shuttle.

## Local ticket holders can take one of two shuttles:

1. **Downtown shuttle:** The downtown shuttle will leave from the train station (across from Pemberton Hotel) on a continuous loop to and from the festival site. The shuttle runs Friday to Sunday from 10:30am to one hour after music ends. A local ticket holder wristband is required. If possible, walk or ride your bike to the shuttle site. If you need to drive, parking is available on the Wye Lands, accessed just beyond Village of Pemberton Municipal Hall on Aster Street.
2. **Pole Yard Shuttle:** If you live north of the festival site, you can park at the Continental Pole Yard (located on Hwy99 just east of Main Street in Mt. Currie) and take the shuttle to the festival site. The shuttle runs Friday to Sunday from 10:30am to one hour after music ends.

## Parking on Festival weekend

To protect parking for local residents, the Village of Pemberton has developed a local parking strategy in collaboration with Pemberton Music Festival.

- From July 17-20, downtown street parking will be limited to four hours.
- From July 17-20, residents will require a residential parking pass for street parking in front of their property. Two passes per residence will be available at Municipal Hall beginning on June 23, 2014. Proof of residence is required.
- Vehicles parked on the street not displaying parking passes will be towed.
- Strata-owned residential properties are responsible for determining their own parking regulations and enforcement.
- There is no street parking (regardless of parking pass) on the following streets (including both Village of Pemberton and SLRD boundaries):
  - Urdal Road
  - Pemberton Farm Road East
  - Fraser Road
  - Collins Road
  - Airport Road
  - Industrial Park (all streets)
