CLEAN UP

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Property clean up is necessary prior to rebuilding. Find more information on safe debris removal under **CLEAN UP** on the [recovery website](#).

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PREPARING FOR CLEAN UP

- Prepare for safe removal of debris - Hire a WorkSafeBC licensed contractor to complete a Hazardous Waste Materials Survey. List: [here](#).
- Uninsured/under-insured property owners may qualify for funding to assist with the Hazardous Material Survey - [more info here](#).

DETERMINE IF RIPARIAN PERMIT NEEDED

Obtain a Riparian Development Permit if disturbing land or using heavy machinery during cleanup in a *riparian area* by submitting the following to the SLRD:

- Completed [Development Application Form](#) and fee.
- Hire a Qualified Environment Professional (QEP) to conduct a *Riparian Assessment Report* that is submitted and approved by the Province. The QEP will facilitate the application to the Aquatic Ecosystems Branch of the Ministry of Water, Land & Resource Stewardship.

DEBRIS REMOVAL

Once a Hazardous Waste Materials survey is conducted and results given to you, email the report along with a completed [Asbestos Declaration and Acknowledgement Form](#) to the SLRD at utilities@slrd.bc.ca. The Asbestos Declaration & Acknowledgement form is required for any drop-off of burnt debris at the Gold Bridge Transfer Station or Lillooet Landfill.

REBUILD

Support is available for the rebuilding process. The SLRD has planners and building officials who will review your rebuilding ideas and work with you to explain all regulations and requirements specific to your property.

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PERMITS AND FORMS

Planning to rebuild starts with a **Building Permit** application - the process is as follows:

- Submit a Building Permit Application and include Hazardous Material Survey results and receipts for disposal.
- The building permit application process is described [here](#).
- If you need to bring more than 10 cubic meters of soil onto the property from outside of the boundaries of your property, please submit a [Soil Deposit Application form](#).
- Other development permits (DPs), such as a Wildfire DP and an additional Riparian DP may be required prior to Building Permit issuance.
