**FREE FIRESMART™ PROGRAM FOR 65+ RESIDENTS LAUNCHED IN LILLOOET  
AND PARTS OF THE REGIONAL DISTRICT**

*SLRD and District of Lillooet hope to target up to 250 properties*

**Pemberton, B.C.** – With support from a provincial FireSmart™ funding program, the Squamish-Lillooet Regional District (SLRD) and District of Lillooet have partnered on a project that will help residents aged 65 and over to reduce the risk of wildfire on their properties, and surrounding areas.

The SLRD has been awarded \$358,000 in FireSmart funding through a one-time COVID-19 economic recovery funding stream of the UBCM Community Resiliency Investment program.

The focus of the project is to conduct FireSmart property assessments for homeowners age 65 and older and then get the recommended yard work done, with a follow up FireSmart assessment to complete the project for each homeowner, all covered within the funding received for this project. Properties must be located in the District of Lillooet, or Electoral Area A or Electoral Area B of the SLRD, and must be the homeowner's primary residence to qualify.

"We are thrilled to have received funds for this important initiative, and to be working together with the District of Lillooet and SLRD Electoral Area B on delivering this program," said SLRD Electoral Area A Director, Sal DeMare.

"This is an important project, and I encourage anyone who is eligible to participate. We saw first-hand this summer, the seriousness of wildfire risk, with parts of Electoral Area B being on evacuation alert and order at various times throughout the season," added SLRD Electoral Area B Director, Vivian Birch-Jones.

"Wildfire risk is a challenge for all of our communities," added District of Lillooet Mayor, Peter Busse. "As we know, wildfires don't recognize community borders. Our entire area is at risk from the threat of wildfires. Every step we can take to address this risk is a step that helps protect the entire area."

Through this partnership, the District of Lillooet and the SLRD are hoping to target up to 250 properties.

Homeowners can apply through the SLRD and, if eligible, the local FireSmart representative will arrange with the homeowner for a time to conduct the FireSmart assessment, and make recommendations on the work required. If the homeowner agrees, a time will then be scheduled for a crew to visit the property to do the recommended work, with a follow up assessment afterwards.
