

## **Film Activity Letter**

**A -**

Filming of scene for the Feature Film, "Revenant."

Scene at Location One is of group of circa late 18<sup>th</sup> century Trappers walking across sandbar carrying injured Trapper on makeshift stretcher.

Location One for this application is on sandbars located approximately at Kilometer marker 16 on Squamish River Forest Main Rd.

Scene at Location Two is of Trapper hunting for prey through brush.

Location Two for this application is on Shovelnose Creek, North end at approx.. Kilometer Marker 19.

Access to Location One will be off Squamish River Forest Main Rd. care of temporary wooden stair/ plywood ramp from roadway level shoulder down to sandbar.

Access to Location Two will also be off Squamish River Forest Main Rd. care of temporary wooden stairs from road shoulder down to creek level

Filming will take place on one day sometime during the last two weeks of October, 2014; specific date yet to be determined.

**B -**

**Location One:** (16km)

Specifics yet to be determined; stair/ramp ( 8 foot) would be placed either day of or day prior to filming. Clean up and removal of gear immediately after completion of filming.

Crew will be primarily on sandbar closest to road. Some crew will accompany actors to nearby sandbar where action is to take place, travelling across nearest channel by secured and controlled raft if necessary.

There will be approximately 40 – 50 staff on location.

Filming should be completed within 8 hours.

Road safety and communication with logging trucks will be through Sqomish Forestry.

First Aid will be care of Company's First Aid attendant.

Sanitation facilities will be care of Washroom Trailer and refuse on site care of Bear Proof totes which will then be transferred to larger bear proof bin – location of which yet to be determined

No Special Effects or Stunts

No adverse disturbance of vegetation or soil.

**Location Two:** (Shovelnose Creek, 19km)

Specifics yet to be determined, staircase would be built up to a week prior to commencement of filming and removed the day after filming scene at this location.

There would be reduced crew numbers at this location due to its confined nature. Crew would be both creekside and above at road level.

Filming should be completed within 8 hours.

Road safety and communication with logging trucks will be through Squamish Forestry.

First Aid will be care of Company's First Aid attendant.

Sanitation facilities will be care of Washroom Trailer and refuse on site care of Bear Proof totes which will then be transferred to larger bear proof bin – location of which yet to be determined

No Special Effects or Stunts

No adverse disturbance of vegetation or soil aside from securing temporary staircase to slope and disturbance due to people walking

Minimum Cast and Crew in actual creek – rest on land, creekside as needed
